STANDARD

Available to academic staff and Higher Degree by Research students

PREMIUM

Available to academic staff who are undertaking (in order of priority):

- Researchers targeted by the Research Portfolio or by faculty research staff as high priority (e.g. SOAR fellows)
- 2. Application for ARC or NHM-RC competitive grant
- Application to other grants schemes, fellowships and prizes
- 4. Application for academic promotions

Most requests are completed within 2 weeks. We may defer requests based on our internal capacity.

Requests to compile customised citation metrics for a group of researchers, for example research team, requires appropriate resourcing.
